- **Ships, Shipping, Shipwrecks and Genealogy**

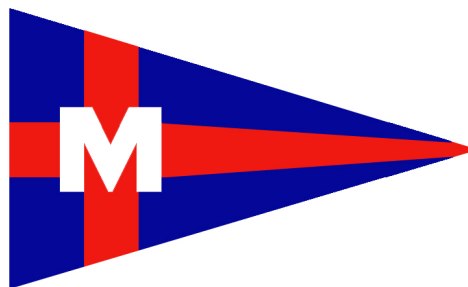
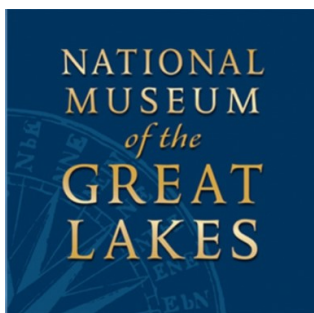
This talk explores the history of shipping on the Great Lakes and showcases resources for people interested in Genealogical research.
